Whereas the Committee received 37 Resolutions submitted from 7 county conventions and 3 Resolutions submitted from 2 individuals of the 9th District for a total of 40 Resolutions submitted for consideration;

Whereas the 40 total Resolutions submitted to the Committee covered 36 different topics;

Whereas the Committee held meetings from April 2nd to April 8th, to review, discuss and debate the Resolutions submitted; and Whereas after much discussion, with a majority of Committee in the affirmative on each Resolution, the Committee passed eight Resolutions for consideration at the GA 9th Republican Party District Convention:

- 1. Calling on Georgia's Congressional Delegation to Mitigate the National Debt,
- 2. OPPOSING a Constitutional Amendment that Would Allow Gambling in the State of Georgia,
- 3. OPPOSING Ranked Choice Voting,
- 4. OPPOSING the Expansion of Non-Partisan Elections,
- 5. OPPOSING Government Infringement on Privacy,
- 6. ENCOURAGING Georgia be removed from the Electronic Registration Information Center
- 7. Celebrating the Life and Legacy of David Ralston; now, therefore, be it

<u>Asking Georgia Legislature to ban</u> <u>Central Bank Digital Currency</u>

WHEREAS, implementation of Central Bank Digital Currency (CBDC) would include a programmable database with complete personal and financial data on every person. The custodians of such database could monitor any activity, e.g. movement, purchases, suppliers, and more, and block, restrict, or otherwise alter any person's attempted transactions; and

WHEREAS, CBDC would be the only means of exchange for goods and services; and

WHEREAS, CBDC would be a necessary step to globalism, socialism, totalitarianism, and finally communism; therefore

BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED THAT the Delegates of this convention urge the Georgia Legislature to pass legislation that bans any Georgia government financial transactions with any entity, including but not limited to, other US states and the US federal government, that uses any form of CBDC and/or other digital currency system; and bans the implementation of, and requirement for, any form of CBDC and/or other digital currency system.

<u>OPPOSING a Constitutional</u> <u>Amendment that Would Allow</u> <u>Gambling in the State of Georgia</u>

- Whereas gambling addiction is classified by the American Psychiatric Association as a mental disorder; similar to opioid and drug addictions, and,
- Whereas gambling disproportionately affects minority communities; it acts as a regressive tax on the poor, intensifies many pre-existing social/welfare problems, creates demands on social services and public safety, and,
- Whereas gambling creates costs others must absorb; contributing to increased crime, loss of employment, personal and business bankruptcies, introduction of organized crime syndicates, negative financial impact on businesses that cater to the food, clothing, and construction services;

BE IT THEREFORE RESOLVED that the 9th District Republican Party:

- 1. Urges all elected state and local officials to oppose any resolution or bill the passage of any type of parimutuel gambling, sports betting, or casino gambling legislation
- 2. Opposes efforts by the General Assembly to enable legislation that places a Constitutional Amendment on the ballet for GA voters to legalize any form of parimutuel gambling, sports betting, or casino gambling

OPPOSING Ranked Choice Voting

Whereas, The United States was created as a Republic which gives a voice to common citizens, and,

Whereas, voting for representation is the primary method by which citizens make their voices heard, and,

Whereas, there are many in the USA who seek to undermine voting and the voice of the people by instituting Ranked Choice Voting, and,

Whereas, the definition of a vote is "a formal indication of a choice between two or more candidates or courses of action, expressed typically through a ballot or a show of hands or by voice", and,

Whereas, this would deprive the people of a contest in which the 2 remaining candidates would campaign for their vote, therefore,

Be It Resolved that the 9th District Republican Party opposes all forms of Ranked Choice Voting, and encourages the Georgia General Assembly to oppose efforts to implement Ranked Choice Voting

OPPOSING THE EXPANSION OF NON-PARTISAN ELECTIONS

Whereas among the purposes of a political party are to help establish and secure majority control within a government while holding those elected to the principles of the party;

Whereas a state law mandating that certain county public officials be elected in non-partisan races removes from the local county Republican party the prerogative of determining whether those offices should remain partisan;

Whereas most county Republican parties survive financially by qualifying Republican candidates for local elective office and keeping half of the qualifying fees;

Whereas any proposed legislation would result in the loss of thousands of dollars for county Republican parties, rendering the county Republican party irrelevant resulting in the loss of public identity, influence, and stature for county Republican parties; now, therefore, be it

Resolved, that the GA 9th District Republican Party:

- 1) opposes such action and will denounce any Republican that supports any future legislation that takes the party out of any influence in selecting elected officials that represent the voters;
- 2) instructs members of the General Assembly for the 9th District to oppose any attempt to remove partisan elections from the grassroots; and
- 3) adopts this Resolution this day, April 15, 2023 and instructs the GA 9th District Republican Party Secretary to transmit this Resolution to the Georgia GOP Resolutions Committee for consideration of approval at 2023 State Convention, members of the General Assembly for the 9th District, and the Governor, Lt. Governor, and Speaker of the House of the State of Georgia.

OPPOSING Government Infringement on Privacy

WHEREAS SB 23 took language from HB 520 that expands the authority of the Georgia Data Analytic Center (GDAC) as the repository and source for sharing of all collected information, and,

WHEREAS OCGA 45-12-153 allows the collection of health data, "(a) Any state agency or department that creates, receives, or maintains publicly supported program, fiscal, or health data ..., and,

WHEREAS the Delegates of the 9th District Republican Party oppose the infringement of privacy and collection of citizens' health data, both physical data and mental data, by the GDAC, therefore,

BE IT THEREFORE RESOLVED; That the Delegates of the 9th District Republican Party encourage our elected Representatives of the Georgia General Assembly to protect Georgia citizen's right to privacy, and repeal sections in the OCGA pertaining to the collection and sharing of citizens' physical health and mental health data.

ENCOURAGING Georgia be removed from the Electronic Registration Information Center

Whereas the State of Georgia participates with the Electronic Registration Information Center (ERIC) in lieu of complying with the 1993 National Voter Registration Act (NVRA) law that requires Georgia to update voter registration logs

Whereas NVRA law includes a "Public Disclosure Provision" which allows the public inspection of "voter list maintenance records", this body demands an audit of the Georgia "Voter List Maintenance Records" according to Federal law U.S.C. 20507(i)(1)

Whereas we demand an audit of Georgia's Voter List Maintenance Records, and suggest using the Coding Accuracy Support System (CASS) used by the US Postal Service and that Georgia discontinue participation with ERIC, therefore

BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED that the Delegates of this Convention collectively demand that Georgia remove itself from participation in ERIC as our sister state of Alabama has recently done and that there is an audit of the GA Voter List Maintenance Records.

Urging GA Legislature to ban ESG
